Local Area Traffic Management Plan studies update

Frankston City Council is undertaking a Local Area Traffic Management (LATM) study in parts of Seaford, Frankston South and Frankston to improve traffic management and road safety within these areas. Council has engaged O'Brien Traffic, a traffic engineering and transport planning consultancy firm to assist with the study.

LATM Update

Stage 1 Consultation was undertaken in October/November 2018 and included a questionnaire survey delivered to all property owners and occupiers, including business operators, in the study area seeking community input. A public meeting was held in November 2018 to listen to the community's views.

Community feedback, together with information from site inspections, traffic surveys and crash data analysis, have contributed to the preparation of a draft Recommended LATM Plan.

Draft Recommended LATM Plan

The draft Recommended LATM Plan is aimed at improving traffic and pedestrian safety, access and amenity, deterring through traffic, and encouraging walking and cycling.

The draft LATM comprises a range of treatments as follows:

- Intersection treatments roundabouts (new and upgraded), raised intersection treatments, splitter islands and line marking improvements;
- Speed management –speed humps and lower speed limit (Railway Parade and Nepean Highway);
- Pedestrian treatments raised/improved zebra crossings, raised school crossings, pedestrian refuge islands and new kerb ramps;
- Other treatments raised median, kerb outstands and No Stopping areas; and
- Treatments for advocacy to VicRoads, the State Government or the Level Crossing Removal Project (LXRP) for treatments on the VicRoads managed roads or along the Railway Line.

The draft Recommended LATM Plan also shows treatments being considered by LXRP.

Following input from the community, the Recommended LATM plan will be finalised presented to Council in mid-2019 for adoption.
